Advent Course - Comfort and Joy - A course for Advent. 16<sup>th</sup> December Luke 1:46-55. The words we know as the Magnificat. To whom does Mary give credit for her being blessed? Hark the herald angels sing: such wonderful words of proclamation and praise. Think on the lines "Late in time behold him come," and "Hail the incarnate deity." Luke 1:67-70,76-79. God's plans take time. Do you get impatient with God sometimes? O little town of Bethlehem. The words "how silently, how silently" do not remind me of a stable with a young woman giving birth! Christ enters into human hearts. How did God enter yours - with a bang or silently?

Luke 2.28-32. We move on to the time when Mary and Joseph took Jesus to be blessed in the temple as the law required. In the Bleak Midwinter. The big question is what can we give to the Lord God Almighty Jesus Christ, not just at the time of Christmas giving, but every day? There are other carols and Christmas hymns you can think of, and readings too. However, we may celebrate Christmas this year, hold fast to the focus.
